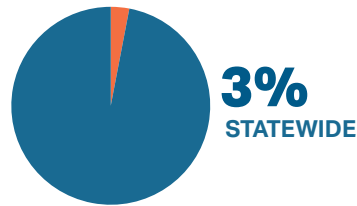
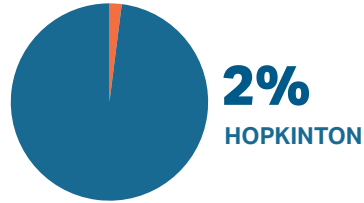
## FAFSA COMPLETION RATES<sup>3</sup>

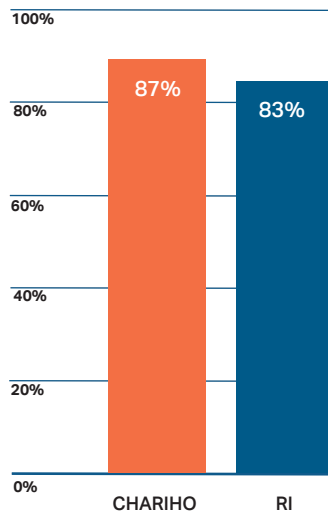

Workers 16+ (n=4,511)

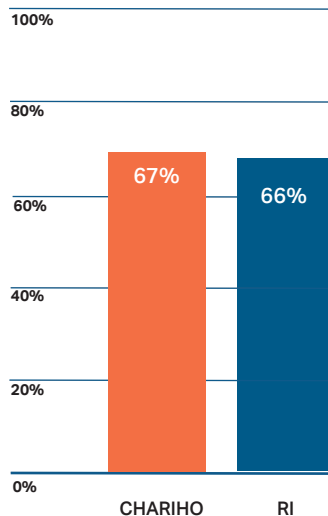
